High Support Inpatient Rehabilitation (Level 2) Service for Men with Complex **Enduring Mental Health Needs**

Cygnet Lodge Brighouse is a high support inpatient rehabilitation (Level 2) service for men. The emphasis within the service is on preparing individuals for discharge or to support with longer term optimal functioning.

Cygnet Lodge Brighouse can support up to 21 men in a relaxed, calm and homely environment. The focus is on helping individuals increase their independence wherever possible through work and education, as well as social and leisure facilities, offering a slower stream rehabilitation service where needed.

As part of the service, we provide a three-bed apartment, Rastrick View. This helps support men to prepare effectively for discharge by further encouraging independence, while maintaining the inputs of the service and staff support where needed. It also provides the chance to evaluate what support a person may need on leaving the service, which can help prevent readmissions and support positive discharges.



Our service user profile:

- > Men aged 18+ years
- > Detained under the Mental Health Act (1983) or informal
- > May require a longer term placement for complex enduring mental health needs
- > Primary diagnosis of mental illness with:
 - Complex comorbidities
 - Substance, drug and alcohol abuse
 - Treatment resistance
 - Behaviours that challenge
- > Aiming for a return to a less restrictive environment

- > History of sexual abuse or domestic violence
- > Typical diagnoses: schizophrenia, schizoaffective disorder, bipolar affective disorder or depression
- > May have a secondary diagnosis of mild learning disability, autism spectrum disorder or personality disorder
- > May have a forensic history and / or be stepping down from the care of the ministry of justice
- > May have a history of repeated acute admissions

Supporting men with a diagnosis of mental illness and associated substance misuse

At Cygnet Lodge Brighouse, we understand that having a history of substance misuse is common and requires assessment and intervention. To support this we have a fully integrated substance misuse service, facilitating 1:1 and group sessions and encouraging the men we support to attend SMART Recovery Meetings. We are also a SMART Recovery partner.





We recognise that:

- > Each individual has unique needs and problems, including those associated with illicit drugs or alcohol
- > One size does not fit all, we will always ensure that the treatment path is responsive to need
- > Service users must have some level of ownership in terms of their treatment
- > A multi-disciplinary approach to treatment ensures all treatment needs are effectively met
- > Recovery is more achievable when effective support mechanisms are in place

We employ our own in-house substance misuse practitioner who provides individual and group support to service users with needs associated with substance misuse.




