Broughton Lodge is a specialist residential service for adults with autism and a learning disability who may present with behaviours that may be of concern. We aim to provide a safe, comfortable and effective care environment for those in our care, promoting independence and community integration. On site we have our multi-disciplinary team (MDT) who assist and support us to provide outcome based care and support pathways.

## Our service at a glance

Depending on the individual's level of need, we have **3 different areas** within the service offering different levels of support, including support for young men and women leaving an educational provision:

- > **Sutton** (8 bedrooms) & **Langley** (8 bedrooms)  
Provide a high level of support for individuals who may be stepping down from a hospital setting or has experienced multiple placement breakdowns.
- > **Bosley** (4 bedrooms)  
Provide a structured programme of vocational activity and daily living skills to enable the individual to experience a less restrictive environment safely.

As part of our care pathway, our service enables residents to build upon earlier learnt skills to achieve further independence, self-advocacy and confidence leading to better quality of life.

Our staff use positive behaviour approaches and are trained in specialised behaviour interventions and sensory integration strategies. A combination of person-centred planning, measurement of progress and a full multi-disciplinary approach can only result in the best outcomes for the individuals in our care.



## Our facilities:

- > En-suite bedrooms, which residents are supported to personalise
- > Multiple good sized living and dining areas in all areas of the service
- > Large activity room containing a multisensory projector and a large interactive tablet
- > Creative room
- > Activities of Daily Living (ADL) skills kitchens
- > Sensory room
- > 4 large gardens with seating areas and outdoor activities
- > Multi-media room
- > Family and friends meeting space

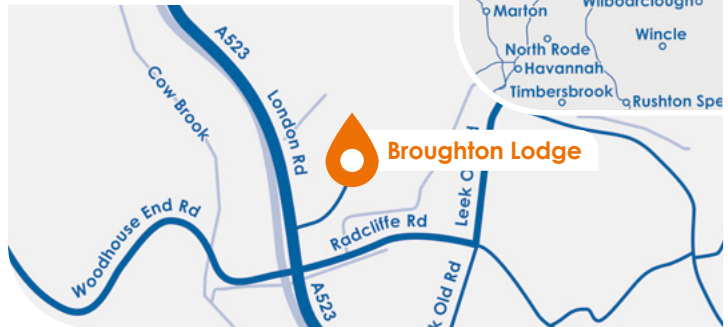

- 1 Referral made to Cygnet Social Care and a desktop assessment is undertaken to review suitability for placement
- 2 If a suitable placement is identified, an assessment is arranged and undertaken by our specialist team
- 3 Feedback is provided on whether our service can meet the individual's needs
- 4 Detailed placement proposal is formulated to include care plans and funding information
- 5 Once placement is confirmed, transition plans are developed with all relevant stakeholders and admission date is agreed
